Further to the notice in last week's news sheet, the PCC has re-considered its decision and has decided that it is not able to maintain our Sunday Zoom Services after **Sunday 11<sup>th</sup> October 2020**. We urge you from **Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> October** to join with our mission partners at **10:30 a.m.** in what will be a fully integrated Service.

We are at a turning point in the life of our Parish. On 7<sup>th</sup> October, representatives from our Parish will join with those from the other Parishes in our new Mission Area. This meeting will explore the way forward for our Parishes as we develop a pattern of Worship and activities that works across the Area as we move into uncharted territory. We are among the first Mission Areas in the Diocese to move through this process and will be able to provide an example to others as to how we can make this pattern of Oversight Ministry work in practice. As we found when our existing 4forMission Partnership was set up there is no definitive plan to follow. There will be changes in the pattern of Worship across the Mission Area as we seek to maximise the limited resources that we have

The Acts of the Apostles and the Epistles give us a picture of how the early Church developed and expanded in their attempts to obey Christ's Last command

Go you, therefore, and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I commanded you; and, Io, I am with you always, even to the end of the world."

The Church in the First Century had a community of Leaders, the Apostles. St Paul's letters encourage all his readers to exercise their own gifts. In 2 Corinthians 12: 14-26 we see the different parts of the body described with stress on their individual importance to the body as a whole.

In a report from the Diocese of Truro, Oversight Ministry within a Parish is described as being "like a merchant ship where all are involved rather than a cruise liner".

We have to work together as a congregation and with our partners in the Mission area to promote our main objective.

The service can be found live on Facebook from around 10:20 a.m. for a 10:30 start and lasts for around one hour. You can use the same process to view recordings of Other Services on the Channel.

## If you have a Facebook Account and use an iPad or other Tablet:

Whichever way you reach Facebook on your device
Search in the App or Facebook page for **Christ Church Ardsley** 

#### If you don't have (or don't want) a Facebook account or use a computer:

Open your Web Browser App

[examples are Chrome, Microsoft Edge, Internet Explorer, Fire Fox etc]
You can then use your favourite search engine [Google, Yahoo, Bing, etc.] and enter
Facebook Church Ardsley

**You should then see** the appropriate link to click which is amongst the top entries

Once here you can save the link in your favourites for next week

Then click on the highlighted **LIVE** tab and then on the particular Video.

You will also need a Zoom link if you want to join in the after Service Break out rooms but this will be supplied by e-mail as we have done so far

You will find that, if you don't have a Facebook Account you will get some nagging screens to create an account. You will be able to see the service by just ignoring these.
