The longer the Pandemic lasts the more decisions seem to pile up for us to make. Can we, should we, is it safe to re-open our Churches and Church Halls? Spiritually, financially, practically—what is of paramount importance to us? I've become more and more interested in different kinds of prayer and worship to help me with these decisions. Some that are very modern, services online, for example and some that are very old.

This brings us to the Prayer Wheel. These were popular in the Middle Ages partly because of their familiar elements in a semi-literate society. The illustration is an English reproduction of a medieval prayer wheel found in the Lisburn Gospel Book and dating from the 13th Century. The original was, of course, in Latin. It would seem to give instruction about finding one's way "home" through the spokes of a wheel finishing in the hub and "God" or "Deus". We travel through the Lord's prayer in the outer section to The Gifts of the Spirit including wisdom and counsel and also events in the life of Jesus. And lastly, the Beatitudes and those groups of people blessed by Jesus.. No-one is quite sure of how it was intended to be used but it seems like in many forms for prayer that it is the act of praying which is important, the prayer wheel is simply a means to an end.
