Epiphany: a moment of sudden realisation

Twelfth Night or the Eve of Epiphany generally marks the end of our Christmas celebrations when we remove our Christmas decorations, although in some traditions they remain until Candlemas at the end of the Epiphany period, 40 days after Christmas.

The Feast of the Epiphany on 6th January marks a second group of visitors to the infant Jesus.

"Behold, there came wise men from the east to Jerusalem, saying, 'where is he that is born King of the Jews? for we have seen his star in the east, and are come to worship'" [St Matthew 2:1-2]

Their visit and the consequences are only recorded in St Matthew's Gospel. Over the centuries different translations and traditions have added to the original description. These include describing them as Kings, that there were three of them to match the three gifts and that they had names. The gifts of gold frankincense and myrrh [2: 11] were very expensive.

Gold was often seen as a gift for a king – the Queen of Sheba brought "very much gold" as a gift for King Solomon [1 Kings 10: 2] It was also specified as the covering for the wood of the Israelite's Altar of Incense [Exodus 30: 3]

Frankincense is a tree resin which creates a strong and beautiful aroma when burnt. It had been specified by the LORD as part of the recipe for incense that was to be solely used in ceremonial worship. [Exodus 30: 34]

Myrrh which is derived from a tree sap, was the main ingredient in the anointing oil used to ceremonially prepare the priests and equipment before sacrifices could be made. [Exodus 30: 23]. It was later used by Nicodemus to prepare the body of Jesus for burial [St John 19: 39-40]

What of the practicalities of these gifts? King Herod was enraged by the failure of the Wise Men to return to him with details of where Jesus was. [St Matthew 2: 12,16] and gave orders to kill all the boys under two years old in Bethlehem. Joseph had been warned by an Angel of the Lord and took Mary and Jesus to safety in Egypt.

Is it reasonable to assume that the gifts would have financed this?

Wise men, sometimes translated as **Magi**, served as advisers in many of the royal courts in the Middle East and as astronomers and astrologers. Daniel had encountered such men in Babylon [Daniel 2: 2,24]. They would have studied many sacred writings which would have included the Hebrew Scriptures and identified all the prophesies that a "King of the Jews" had been predicted for centuries. The appearance of **a star**, however we may describe it today, was enough to trigger their quest.
