What a week!

Jesus was travelling towards Jerusalem with His disciples at the time of Passover despite warnings that King Herod was plotting to kill Him [Luke 13:31]. As the centre of Judaism, Jerusalem was the place to be at Passover and visitors from all over the then known world would have been there. We can get an idea of the range from the fifteen groups identified in the response to Peter's exposition at Pentecost [Acts 2: 8-11].

Since the breakup of the Kingdom and the exile in Babylon. the Israelites had been subjected to external control with the Roman Empire being the latest. Through the writings of the Prophets, they had been promised a **Messiah**, an anointed one, who would revive and rule over them.

In the Synagogue in Nazareth, at the start of His Ministry, Jesus had read a section from Isaiah [Luke 4:18-19; Isaiah 61: 1-2] and identified Himself as **The Anointed One**.

The sight of Jesus entering Jerusalem on a donkey would have been unexpected of the Messiah and over the following days the cries of "Hosanna to the Son of David" [Matthew 21: 9] turned to "Crucify Him!" [St Luke 23: 21].

The events of what we now call Holy Week include Jesus continuing to preach daily in the Temple [St Luke 23: 47], clearing the Temple of the money changers and those who sold animals for the ritual sacrifices, [St Matthew 21: 12-13] and healing the blind and lame [St Matthew 21: 14].

Jesus and His disciples celebrated the Passover in the Upper Room and Jesus was betrayed to the Jewish leaders by Judas Iscariot. [St Mark 14: 17-25]

The week ended with Jesus crucified and buried in a tomb. The disciples were despondent, forced to meet behind locked doors and fearful for their own lives. [St John 20: 19]

Spoiler alert: We know that this was not the end....
