The Ten Commandments and a Golden Calf – A wayward people.

A few weeks after the Israelites had left their slavery in Egypt and the miraculous crossing of the Red Sea, they came to the Sinai desert and camped close to Mount Sinai. [Exodus 19: 1, 2]. Moses then spent some time away from them talking to the Lord. He received a promise for the people that, subject to them obeying the Lord, they would be a Holy Nation for the LORD [Exodus 19:6]. Moses returned to the people who, when told of this, agreed wholeheartedly.

Three days later, a cloud descended on the mountain with thunder and lightning which was seen as a sign that the LORD was present. It seems that the words of what we know as the Ten Commandments were spoken by the LORD in the presence of the people. [Exodus 20].

Moses then received a range of other instructions from the LORD and the various Festivals which were to be celebrated. [Exodus 20: 22 to 23:33]

After building an altar to the LORD and consecrating the people, Moses went up the mountain and spend 40 days and nights within the cloud, in the presence of the LORD. [Exodus 24:] During this time, Moses received two stone tablets with the Commandments inscribed by the finger of God [Deuteronomy 9: 9]. Moses was also given instructions to collect gifts from the people and to create a Tabernacle which would act as a place for the LORD to be with the people. [Exodus 25].

Meanwhile, back at ground level, the Israelites were concerned that something had happened to "this fellow Moses" leaving them leaderless. They persuaded Aaron to fashion them gods to go before them. [Exodus 32: 1] Aaron collected gold earrings from the people and made a figure of a calf. He set up an altar and declared a festival.

The LORD heard and saw what the people were doing and threatened to destroy them and make a new nation from Moses [Exodus 32: 9,10]. Moses made a plea to the LORD to remember His Covenants with Abraham, Isaac and Jacob and emphasised the potential response from the Egyptians to the Israelites being taken out of Egypt by their LORD, only to kill them in the mountains [Exodus 32; 11-14.]

The LORD relented and sent Moses back to the people noting that they were *quick to turn away from the Commandments* [Exodus 32: 8].

Moses returned, saw the altar and calf and was so angry that he smashed the stone tablets, tore down and burned the calf, ground it into powder, scattered it on the water and made the Israelites drink the water.

As we read the books of the Old Testament we see that rebellion against the Lord formed a regular pattern throughout the history of the Israelites, culminating several centuries later in the breakup of the Kingdom and exile of the people.
