Living Water and a Samaritan woman

The history of the Samaritans starts with the breaking up of the Israelite Kingdom into the northern kingdom of Israel and the Southern Kingdom of Judah. The Kingdom of Israel was overrun by the Assyrians and many of the population inter-married with the local pagan tribes. They did keep some of their Jewish traditions including the worship of Yahweh andwere despised by the Jews. Their lands lay between Jerusalem and Galilee and most travellers along that way would take a detour rather than pass through Samaria.

With this background we find Jesus making this journey and reaching the Samaritan town of Sychar [St John 4: 5]. Whilst sitting near the well, Jesus encounters a Samaritan woman and asks for water from the well. This astounded the woman [4: 9] but Jesus offers the woman **Living Water springing up to eternal life** [4: 14]. The woman initially misses the point, but Jesus eventually reveals himself as the Messiah. The woman spreads the news and many of the locals believed. 'we have heard for ourselves, and we know that this man really is the Saviour of the world.'

Forty years in the desert

It didn't take long for the Israelites to forget the dramatic way that the LORD had led them out of Egypt. Their route took them through the desert of Shur [Exodus 15: 22] where they travelled for three days without finding water. Moses was the target for their grumbles when they came to a spring at Marah where the water was unfit to drink. [Exodus 15:24] Moses prayed to the Lord and was shown a stick which, when thrown into the water, made it fit to drink. [15: 25] They then travelled to Elim and on into the Desert of Sin. The grumbling against Moses resumed but this time about the lack of food. Some even wished themselves back in Egypt. For the next forty years, the Lord provided Manna in the mornings to feed the Israelites but some even failed to heed the Lord's instructions about it. [Exodus 16: 17-30] The Israelites journeyed on through the desert and the grumbling continued. The Lord guided Moses to strike his rod against a stone through which water was provided. We read of a similar incident where Moses was told by the Lord to speak to the rock [Numbers 20: 6-11] to provide water. Moses actually struck the rock with his rod which, because his perceived lack of trust prompted the Lord to deny Moses entry to he Promised Land. [Numbers 20: 12]
