Discipleship

Throughout His earthly ministry, Jesus attracted many followers who were keen to hear His parables and to witness His miracles. We read in St John's Gospel how Andrew and Philip came to be disciples [St John 1: 39-40, 43] What were their next recorded actions? To bring Peter and Nathanial to Jesus. [St John 1: 42,45].

The group of disciples whom we normally refer to as "The Twelve" were sent out with strict instructions and the authority over impure spirits. [Mark 6: 8-11] They were successful in healing the sick and driving out demons [Mark 6: 16]. On a later occasion Jesus sent out 72, in pairs, to prepare the villages and towns that Jesus was to visit with a similar result. As part of this commission, Jesus told them "The harvest is plentiful, but the workers are few, ask the Lord of the Harvest to send out workers into His harvest field" [Luke 10: 2]. In his final earthly command, Jesus told the eleven disciples to "go and make disciples of all nations" [St Matthew 28: 19]. We share that same command.

A disciple is one who grows in Christ through the Bible, prayer, service and worship, but above all one who should put their faith into practice as we seek to bring 98% of our population to know Jesus as Saviour. It has always been a difficult task. If you think of the Parable of the Sower [Mark 4: 1-20], only a fraction of the seed produced a crop. In St John 6: 66 we find that some of the extended group of disciples were unable to keep the commitment. Peter summed it up for the Twelve, "To whom shall we go? You are the Christ, the Son of the Living God" [St John 6: 68]

To help us grow as disciples, a wide range of Bible reading notes are available for individual study: join in our monthly Prayer Meeting or a Fellowship Group: take a part in our worship by reading, praying or greeting the congregation or become involved in our other activities as they re-start.

The Tithe

Esau and Jacob are the first twins to be recorded in the Bible. Even before they were born they were struggling together. [Genesis 25: 22].

As the younger son of Isaac and Rebekah, Jacob had tricked his father into giving him his blessing rather than his older brother Esau. [Genesis 27: 1-46] To escape Esau's threats, Jacob was sent to stay with Rebekah's brother Laban in Harran.

Whilst taking a night's rest on his journey from Beersheba to Harran, Jacob had a dream of a stairway between Earth and Heaven with angels ascending and descending. [Genesis 28: 10-22] He had a vision of the Lord who reaffirmed the promises made to Isaac and Abraham that Jacob's descendants would be 'like the dust of the earth' [20: 14]. On waking, Jacob made a vow to the Lord that "of all that You give me I will give You a tenth." [20: 22]

The word tithe has a more recent origin based on Old English and represents one tenth of the annual produce of land and labour which was taken as a tax to support the Church and Clergy.

Should we consider tithing as a guide when we decide how we are going to support the work of Mission in our Parish and in the wider Church? It is of course your decision, but should our choices also apply to our time and abilities?
