## **Public Worship and Private Prayer**

Our Churches remain closed for Public Worship and Private Prayer

## 1st Sunday before Lent

We are now approaching the forty days of Lent where we prepare to rediscover the details of the last days of our Lord's ministry on Earth in the events during what we call Holy Week.

**The season of Lent** was introduced into the Church calendar as a reminder of the 40 days that Jesus spent in the wilderness, preparing for the start of his Earthly ministry and where He denied the temptations to take Satan's path.

The Sundays between the end of the Epiphany Season and Lent are now described in Common Worship as Ordinary Time and the number changes from year to year as the date of Easter varies.

**Shrovetide** traditionally started three Sundays before Lent and was a time of preparation and decision making on which of the pleasures and luxuries were to be given up during Lent. Shrovetide, named from shriving or receiving Absolution for Sins, continues in some countries as a season of Carnival celebrations which culminate in Mardi Gras – [French for Fat Tuesday].

**Shrove Tuesday** is the only remaining part of Shrovetide which appears in our calendar. During Lent the tradition was to eat more simple food and to fast regularly. Without our modern preservation methods, Shrove Tuesday became a last celebration to use up such as fats, eggs, milk and sugar. This sounds very much like the list of ingredients for pancakes which is where the alternative secular name of Pancake Day arises.

In a tradition said to date from 1445, twenty-five ladies of Olney in Buckinghamshire compete in a Pancake Race over a distance of 415 yards [380 metres]. They dress as 'traditional housewives' and carry a frying pan with a pancake which must be tossed at regular intervals before the finish line at the door of the Parish Church.

**Ash Wednesday** as the first day of Lent is seen as the day of repentance in preparation for the rest of the Lenten season. Ashes have long been seen as a symbol of repentance as typified in Job 42:6, when Job, at the lowest point in his life, says to the Lord "I despise myself and repent in dust and ashes". In some Church traditions, ashes from the burning of the previous year's Palm Sunday Crosses are smeared in the shape of a cross on the forehead in a reminder of the water of Baptism.
