Mothering Sunday

The fourth Sunday of Lent, otherwise Mid-Lent Sunday or Refreshment Sunday was a day when the rigorous observations of Lent were briefly relaxed.

The link between Mid-Lent Sunday and mothers dates to the 8th Century where the set readings in the then current Lectionary made direct or indirect references to mothers. The Book of Common Prayer retained these same passages and in the 16th Century a tradition built up that people would 'go-a-Mothering' as they made the journey to their

Mother Church, usually the main church or Cathedral in the area or the church in which they were baptised. A holiday atmosphere surrounding this event and domestic servants were allowed time off to visit their families as well as their Mother Church. They were responding to the psalmist's "I was glad when they said unto me, let us go into the house of the LORD." [Psalm 121: 1]

There is some confusion between what we call Mothering Sunday and Mother's Day. Mother's Day was officially inaugurated in 1914 by the then US President Woodrow Wilson as a National Day to recognise mothers and motherhood. Celebrated on the second Sunday of May, Mother's Day has been joined by Father's Day, Sibling's Day, Grandparents' Day and even Mother-in-Law's Day (or Mothers' in Law Day?). Even though the Mother's Day title has become more prevalent in the UK, the date has remained as the 4th Sunday of Lent.

One food item associated with Mothering Sunday is the Simnel Cake, a light fruitcake with two layers of marzipan, one in the middle and one on top. The top has eleven marzipan balls said to represent the eleven faithful disciples. In more recent times they have become associated with Easter, but you will no doubt be able to buy one online for most of the year!
