Ringing for the King

The Bell Ringers had a very busy Coronation weekend. It started at 9:00 a.m. on Coronation Day when Chris Walton took his two new flag-raising apprentices, Will Stanton and Seb Walton, to change the flag on the tower roof from St George's to the Union Flag. They were then joined in the Ringing Chamber by fellow ringers Ray, Julie, Mike and Kay to ring seven bells for 30 minutes to start the Coronation Day with a joyous sound.

After the Coronation, at 2:30 p.m., 6 ringers rang a 'Quarter Peal' for 45 minutes - Chris, Tom, Kay and Mike plus two helpers from Monk Bretton, Mike and Ted. This band included three octogenarians who had all watched the previous coronation as youngsters.

On Sunday, after ringing for morning service as usual, we rang at midday for the Parish Picnic which enjoyed lovely sunshine - but we saw nothing of it as we were up the tower the entire time and welcomed 14 various visitors who came to see the bells and bellringing in action.

It was a privilege and joy to join with ringers up and down the country in ringing for our new King.

Reinstatement and Ascension

Over a period of forty days from the Day of Resurrection, Jesus appeared several times to his disciples either individually or in groups. Thirteen occasions are recorded in the New Testament with one group numbering over 500 [1 Corinthians 15: 6]

A group of the disciples, Peter, James, John, Thomas, Nathanael and two others had returned to Galilee [St John 21: 1,2]. One evening, Peter decided to go fishing and the others accompanied him. They spent all night but caught nothing. In the morning they saw a figure on the shore who, having found out that they had caught nothing, told Peter to throw his net on the right sided of the boat. Probably with some reluctance, Peter did so, and the net was filled with 153 fish. John was the first to recognise Jesus. They came to shore and met Jesus near a small fire. Some of the fish was cooked and, along with some bread was shared between them

After the breakfast meal, Peter was given the chance to redeem his denials of Jesus by answering the question "do you love me more than these" three times. Peter was given the commands to Feed my lambs, Take care of my sheep and Feed my Sheep, [St John 21: 15,16,17]

The final appearance of Jesus took place near Bethany. Jesus met the disciples and 'opened their minds' so that they could understand the Scriptures [St Luke 24: 45]. Their task was to spread the news of repentance and forgiveness to all nations, beginning in Jerusalem. They were to stay in Jerusalem for a few days before they would receive the Holy Spirit at Pentecost.

With a final blessing Jesus left his disciples and was taken up into heaven [St Luke 24: 51].

This same Jesus, who has been taken from you into heaven, will come back in the same way you have seen him go into heaven." [Acts 1: 11]

Preparation

The day before the Sabbath was classed as a day of preparation allowing the Jews to prepare food for the Sabbath. According to the fourth Commandment [Exodus 20: 8, 9, 10] the Jews had to "Remember the Sabbath Day by keeping it holy". No work had to be done but generations of religious leaders had generated many more strict conditions on Sabbath Day observance.

Almost all the writings of the Prophets were in preparation for the coming Messiah, such as "prepare the way for the Lord; make straight in the desert a highway for our God". [Isaiah 40: 3]. Throughout His ministry Jesus spent a large amount of his time with the Disciples in preparing them for what was to come with his impending arrest, trial, crucifixion, resurrection and ascension. At the last meal that they shared with Jesus, the disciples were comforted and prepared by the words "My Father's house has many rooms; if that were not so, would I have told you that I am going there to prepare a place for you?" [St John 14: 2]
