The reset button: Behold I am making everything new [Revelation 21:5]

A new Heaven and a new Earth

When the original operating system for IBM PCs was being developed, a certain combination of key presses was incorporated to allow the computer to be reset without switching the power on and off. Many of the early computers also had a reset button to achieve the same effect.

In chapter 25 of Revelation, St John is given sight of the Judgement to come when God choses to press our world's reset button.

In Genesis we read that "**God saw all that he had made, and it was very good**." [Genesis 1: 31]. Before long the combined efforts of Satan and humankind changed this and we continue to dwell in a world which most of us would not describe as very good.

The Old Testament Prophets attempted to bring the people of Israel back to their LORD. Some were successful but the people soon reverted to their old ways.

Isaiah's prophesy includes details of the processes of Judgement and Salvation and the promise of a new Heaven and a new Earth [Isaiah 65: 17-24]. To the Israelites this would have meant the earthly hope of the LORD establishing a single stable Kingdom across the earth centred on Jerusalem.

In his second letter "to those who have received a faith as precious as ours" [2 Peter 1: 1], Peter indicates the future for which he is waiting - "But in keeping with His promise we are looking forward to a new heaven and a new earth, where righteousness dwells." [2 Peter 3: 13]

St John's vision in Revelation continued with a sight of the new Heaven and New Earth [Revelation 21: 1-2] which will replace the first Heaven and the first Earth, with the Holy City, the New Jerusalem coming out of heaven from God and where God will live with His people. We know few details of what the new Earth will be like except that it will be free from sin, evil, sickness, suffering, and death. Jesus encouraged His disciples with a description of His Father's house with many rooms and that He would return to take them to be with Him. Thomas voiced the question that they didn't know the way. Jesus replied "I am the way and the truth and the life" [St John 14: 6]

When we take this on board and believe, *we* become a new creation "**if anyone is in Christ, the new creation has come: The old has gone, the new is here!**" [2 Corinthians 5:17]

What do we need to do?

"We should grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ." [2 Peter 3: 18] **How can we grow?**

Study God's word in the Bible: Pray individually and collectively: share fellowship with other believers.

Focus on Daniel

Daniel was among those taken into captivity by the Babylonians. Along with his friends Hananiah, Azariah and Mishael, he was chosen to serve in the court of Nebuchadnezzar. They continued to remain true to the LORD and were thus given wisdom by the LORD which exceeded that of the magicians and enchanters of the Kingdom. [Daniel 1: 20]

Nebuchadnezzar, was troubled by a dream of a large statue with a golden head and feet of iron and clay. A large rock came and struck the feet of iron and clay and the statue was smashed and blown away. The rock grew into a mountain that filled the whole earth.

The LORD gave Daniel the ability to interpret the dream in that the golden head represented Nebuchadnezzar and the rock represented the final and eternal kingdom which the LORD would establish.

Daniel himself had a vision of four beasts [Daniel 7] representing the rulers of the four kingdoms with the fourth kingdom subdiving the

rulers of the four kingdoms with the fourth kingdom subduing the whole earth. It was during this vision that Daniel used the term **Son of Man** to describe the forthcoming ruler. At the Last Supper, Jesus describes himself as the **Son of Man** to His disciples [St Matthew 26: 2, 23, 24, 45] and later to the High Priest [St Matthew 26: 64].
