"The Lord has risen indeed" [St Luke 24: 34]

Jesus was crucified and buried on the day before the Sabbath. The Tomb was sealed and a guard placed on it by the Chief Priests. This was to prevent the disciples removing and hiding the body of Jesus, and then falsely claiming that resurrection had indeed taken place.

On the day after the Sabbath, Mary Magdalene, Mary the mother of James, Joanna and others of the women went to the tomb to complete the process of burial. They were not sure how they would gain access to the Tomb. [St Mark 16: 3]. All four Gospels tell us that the stone was removed but only St Matthew describes the mechanism of removal. [St Matthew 28: 2]. Mary Magdalene was given the great privilege of having the first recorded conversation with the Risen Jesus.

Mary had seen the open Tomb and fetched the other disciples. [St John 20: 1-3]. Peter and John came to the Tomb but Peter went into the Tomb first where he found the linen cloths that had been used to wrap the body of Jesus and the face-covering napkin rolled separately. [St John 20: 6-7]. All the references that Jesus had made to His Resurrection were forgotten as the disciples returned to their homes. [St John 20: 9-10]

Mary had remained near the Tomb and was greeted by two Angels who asked why she was weeping [St John 20: 11-13]. Mary responded with "They have taken my Lord away and I don't know where they have put him". A third figure appeared, and Mary gave the same response. Mary did not know who this was until the single word "Mary" identified the man as Jesus. [St John 20: 16]. Her reply was "Rabboni!", Teacher.

Mary quickly returned to the disciples with the news that she had seen Jesus.

Later in the day, the disciples were in a locked room for fear of the Jews when Jesus appeared to them. [St John 20: 19:23]. The disciples were given a commission which also applies to us.

"As the Father has sent me, I am sending you."

[St John 20: 21]

The Road to Emmaus (and back)

The disciples had seen the empty Tomb and heard the witness statements of Mary and the other women but were still not convinced. [St Luke 24: 11].

Later in the day Cleopas and a companion were walking to Emmaus, a village a few miles from Jerusalem and discussing what they had seen and heard. They were joined by a stranger who, after finding out their topic of conversation, went on to interpret all the references to the Messiah from the Jewish Scriptures. [St Luke 24: 13-35].

Encouraged to stay for an evening meal the stranger was immediately revealed to them, in the breaking of bread, as the risen Jesus. A hasty return to Jerusalem brought the news to the other disciples.

As we break and share bread in our Communion Services, do we meet with the Risen Jesus?
