Priorities:

Would you rise to a challenge? Here is one! How many women are mentioned in the Bible who contributed to God's work in the world and the advancement of His Kingdom? Why not make your own list and compare it with others? Some names will be obvious such as Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Jesus but what about the rest?

Jochebed attempted to hide the birth of her son Moses from the Egyptian authorities. Her daughter **Miriam** watched over Moses in his floating crib on the river Nile. Pharoah's daughter took pity on Moses and set out to adopt him. With Miriam's intervention, Moses was returned to his mother to be looked after until he was able to move into the house of Pharoah's daughter. [Exodus 2: 1-10]

Ruth was a native of Moab, a land to the east of the Dead Sea. Elimelech, a native of Bethlehem, migrated to Moab with his wife Naomi and his two sons during one of the many local famines. [Ruth 1: 1-2] Sometime later Elimelech died, and his sons married Moabite women, Orpah and Ruth. Some ten years later still, both sons died. [Ruth 1: 3-4]. Naomi had heard that the Lord had provided food in her home country and decided to return. Ruth chose go with her mother-in-law saying, "**Your people will be my people, and your God will be my God**." [Ruth 1: 16]. On their return to Bethlehem, Naomi's kinsman Boaz supported Ruth and Naomi and eventually married Ruth. Their son Obed was to be the grandfather of King David. Ruth's priority was her adopted Lord.

Deborah was one of the Judges who ruled the Israelites before the LORD's establishment of the Israelite Monarchy. The role of a Judge dated back to the time of Moses when they were appointed by Moses to help him resolve disputes among the people. [Exodus 18: 24-25].

Deborah was Judge during a twenty-year period when the Israelites were "in the hands of Jabin, King of Canaan" [Judges 4: 2]. She passed on the LORD's command to Barak to raise an army which he would lead against the army of King Jabin. The Israelite army defeated King Jabin's army and eventually destroyed the King. A period of peace then lasted for forty years [Judges 5: 31] Deborah's priority was the instructions from the LORD

Hannah was the wife of Elkanah but was childless. [1 Samuel 1-2]. Her priority was earnest prayer to the LORD for a son. [1 Samuel 1: 10-18]. The LORD honoured her prayers and gave her a son, Samuel who was to become the last of the long line of Judges of the Israelites.

Mary and Martha were witnesses to one of the more spectacular miracles when Jesus raised their brother Lazarus [St John 11: 1-44]. On another occasion Jesus was invited to a meal with them. [St John 12: 1:8]. Martha was so tied up in the preparations that she became upset when Mary had spent her time listening to thew words of Jesus. In the account of the death and resurrection of Lazarus, it is Martha who leaves he house to meet Jesus. [St John 11: 20]. She shows her faith by responding "Yes, Lord, I believe that you are the Messiah, the Son of God, who is to come into the world." [St John 11: 27]

A Focus on Prayer:
