Wath Deanery Synod: Parish Representative needed...

The Church of England is made up of Dioceses which are split into smaller groups - the Deaneries. Representatives from the Parishes in our Wath Deanery meet three or four times a year in a relaxed social gathering in one of the Parishes (with refreshments!). Items are discussed in different ways including guest speakers and informal group chats covering important topics relevant to the individual churches, the Deanery and Diocese, and the national and worldwide church.

Our Parish has three representatives normally elected at our Annual Meeting. Olive Shaw and Jo Darlison are our current representatives with one vacancy. We need a willing volunteer to take on this role and act as the link between the Deanery Synod and our PCC and Parish at this important time. Are you called to contribute to our Church life in this way?

Focus on the Gospel Writers: St Luke: 18th October

Luke is considered to be a Gentile convert from Antioch in Syria who accompanied St Paul on some of his Missionary Journeys. He is described by St Paul as a *fellow worker* [Philemon 1: 24] and as the *Beloved Physician* [Colossians 4: 14]. He is credited as the author of the third Gospel and of the Acts of the Apostles. For his Gospel, Luke relied on the eye-witness accounts of the Apostles and the other Disciples to create a record of 'the things which have been accomplished among us' [Luke 1: 1]. The Gospel narrative begins with the births of John the Baptist and Jesus and ends with the Ascension. The Acts of the Apostles follows on to record the development and spread of the early Church through the Roman Empire and beyond and ends with St Paul imprisoned in Rome awaiting trial. In the closing sentences of one of his last letters St Paul writes 'only Luke is with me'. [2 Timothy 4:11] Early in his Gospel Luke records the words of Simeon when he describes the infant Jesus as 'a *light for revelation to the Gentiles, and the glory of Your people Israel.'* [St Luke 2:32]. Throughout his writings Luke emphasises that the Gospel is for all people which, of course, includes us.

Collect for St Luke's Day

24th October:

Almighty God, you called Luke the physician, whose praise is in the Gospel, to be an evangelist and physician of the soul: by the grace of the Spirit and through the wholesome medicine of the Gospel, give your Church the same love and power to heal; through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.
