#### An unwanted and un-opened Gift?

Many of us will have scoured our lofts and cupboards for items that were put away last January. They will have been dusted off and will be displayed for a few days before being packed away and returned to storage.

Most families will have their own established traditions surrounding decorations and the giving and receiving of gifts at Christmas. Some may open their gifts straight away or put them under the Christmas Tree to open on Christmas Day. The choice of gift for each recipient may take us some time but we can all receive a unique gift this Christmas that took centuries to develop.

The season of Advent has once again reminded us of the fraught relationship between the Lord and the Israelites and the regular messages from the Prophets for them to repent. A common theme throughout these Prophetic writings is the promise of a Messiah who would come to redeem His people. At Christmas we celebrate the first stage of this process in the birth of Jesus. We may have a crib scene as part of our decorations but let us keep Jesus in our hearts rather than back into storage as a symbolic baby with our other decorations. Remember that in around 105 days, we will be celebrating the culmination of the redemption process with the celebration of our Lord's Resurrection. Let us not reject the most precious gift we can receive and in which we have the promise of eternal life.

For unto us a Child is born, unto us a Son is given; And the government shall be upon His shoulder. And His name shall be called... Wonderful Counsellor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. [Isaiah 9: 6]
