The Biblical record of the life of Noah [Genesis 6: 9 – 9: 20] includes a promise from the Lord that "as long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never cease." [8: 22]

We will celebrate this year's Harvest on Sunday 3rd October. As part of our thanksgiving for the cycle of production that allows us to feed ourselves we are supporting two projects, one worldwide and one more local.

First Fruits

In our northern environment, the end of September turns our thoughts to the autumnal Harvest. The field and garden seeds planted in spring, or even last autumn, have grown and produced their crops to feed us through the coming winter months and to give seed for the next plantings.

The LORD promised the wandering Israelites "a land with wheat and barley, vines and fig trees, pomegranates, olive oil and honey" [Deuteronomy 8: 8]

Once established in the Promised Land, they were prompted to give thinks to the LORD at the beginning of each phase in the harvesting of their crops. The wheat and barley were sown in autumn and reaped in spring. The first sheaf of grain to be harvested had to be taken to the Priest and ceremonially waved before the Lord before any more could be harvested or used. This ceremony took place on the day after the Sabbath of the Feast of Unleavened Bread. [Leviticus 23: 9:14] This with Passover immediately before marked the last of the Ten Plagues which forced Pharoah to allow the Israelites to leave Egypt and their last meal there [Exodus 11: 4-8, 12: 29-30].

The first fruits of the summer harvests of grapes and of olives were brought after Pentecost as the summer season progressed.

How do First Fruits relate to us?

"But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep" [1 Corinthians 20: 20]
