Obadiah and the Edomites

The book of Obadiah is the shortest book in the Old Testament with only twenty-one verses. Unlike the other books of Prophecy, we are given no clue as to who wrote it or when it was written. The name Obadiah can be translated as 'Worshipper of Yahweh' or 'Servant of Yahweh'. The name Obadiah can be found 13 times throughout the Old Testament with little evidence to which, if any, was the author. Wikipedia sums up this uncertainty by saying 'The authorship of the Book of Obadiah is traditionally attributed to the prophet Obadiah'.

The Kingdom of Edom occupied the mountainous lands to the south of the Kingdom of Judah and the Dead Sea in an area split between modern day Israel and Jordan. Edom was an alternative name used to describe Esau the twin brother of Jacob, [Genesis 25: 30] The twins were totally different in appearance and in interests. [Genesis 25: 27,28]. Their father Isaac was tricked by his wife Rebekah and Jacob into giving Jacob his father's blessing [Genesis 27: 1-40]. Esau and his family eventually settled in the lands to the south and eventually established the kingdom of Edom which is derived from the word red which was also used to describe Esau. [Genesis 25: 30]

The Edomites had been enemies of the Israelites for centuries. As Moses was leading the Israelites towards Canaan, Kadesh, King of Edom, had forbidden them from passing through his territory [Numbers 20: 14-21] and threatened them with a large army.

For a time, Edom was under the control of Judah but rebelled and set up its own king. King Jehoram of Judah attempted to subdue them but failed and the enmity continued. [2 Kings 8: 20-22]

With this background, Obadiah's Vision from the LORD was directed at Edom. Their fate was to be destroyed as a kingdom. They were condemned for their attitude to and relationships with the Kingdom of Israel. The kingdom was over-run by King Nebuchadnezzar and the remnants migrated west into an area which became named Idumea. Their lands were subdued in the second Century BC and the people forced to become Jews. With the Roman occupation of the whole area, Antipater, a Idumean, was created Procurator of Judea by Julius Caesar. Antpater's son was Herod the Great and his grandson was Herod Antipas who played their parts in the events surrounding the Birth and Death of our Lord.

The faith of a Canaanite woman [Matthew 15: 21-28]

The region of Tyre and Sidon borders on the Mediterranean Sea and the cites were important in Biblical times. They were in an area of Canaan not conquered by the Israelites and were the subject of many prophetic warnings for their dealings with the Israelites [e.g. Joel 3: 4]. They were mentioned by Jesus during his shaming of the Jewish towns that had rejected his ministry. [Matthew 11: 20-24].

Jesus was in this area when he was approached by a Canaanite woman. Her daughter was demon possessed and the disciples urged Jesus to send her away. Unlike many of the Jews, and, at this point most of the disciples, she had identified Jesus as the Messiah and pleaded for help for her daughter. Her persistence and a valid response to the concerns that Jesus had bout His 'coming to the lost sheep of the House of Israel' and the non-Jews receiving the crumbs from the master's table earned her a commendation for her faith and healing for her daughter.
