#### **Jeremiah**

Jeremiah is one of the major prophets of the Old Testament who was active between 626 BC and 587 BC, which covered the reign of King Josiah and beyond. Jeremiah was moved by the LORD to issue warnings to the people of Judah that Jerusalem would be destroyed by invaders from the north and that the people would be taken into exile.

This was brought on by their repeated failures to trust the LORD in religious and national affairs. They had adopted many of the rituals of the local tribes including the Canaanite's devotion to the fertility god Baal.

King Josiah had attempted to return them to the worship of the LORD, but after his death, in their turns, his sons became King but quickly turned back to ignoring the LORD.

After the battle in which Josiah was killed, Pharoah Necko of Egypt left a sizable contingent of his army in Judah. Josiah's son Jehoahaz reigned for only three months before being deposed by Necko and taken to Egypt in chains. [2 Kings 23: 30-33]; Jehoahaz is a king described as doing evil in the sight of the Lord.

The next in line was Jehoiakim, again put in place by Necko. He lasted eleven years but also did evil in the sight of the Lord [2 Kings 23: 36-37]. During his reign Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon invaded Judah and Jehoiakim became a vassal king. After three years Jehoiakim rebelled against Babylon, but the response was a severe and ongoing occupation. He was dethroned and succeeded by his son Jehoiachin. After three months Nebuchadnezzar took Jehoiachin prisoner and began the process of removing the people into exile in Babylon.

The final king of Judah was Zedekiah who reigned for eleven years having been put in place by Nebuchadnezzar. Despite having Jeremiah as his counsellor, he chose to ignore his advice and shared the description of doing evil in the sight of the Lord. His reign ended when Nebuchadnezzar succeeded in capturing Jerusalem after a lengthy siege. The Temple of Solomon and the city of Jerusalem were destroyed. The repeated warnings by the prophets had come to pass.

Jeremiah was despised and rejected by his own people but there are many references to his words throughout the New Testament. In one example, Jesus berates His disciples with the question "Do you have eyes but fail to see, and ears but fail to hear?" [St Mark 8: 18]. Compare this with "Hear this, you foolish and senseless people, who have eyes but do not see, who have ears but do not hear": [Jeremiah 5: 21]

Jeremiah is often described as the Weeping Prophet with many of his writings including such as this...

If you do not listen, I will weep in secret because of your pride; my eyes will weep bitterly, overflowing with tears, because the Lord's flock will be taken captive. [Jeremiah 13: 17]

Psalm 103: 1; 8

Praise the Lord, my soul; all my inmost being, praise his holy name.
 The Lord is compassionate and gracious, slow to anger, abounding in love.



Sabbath Rules: read St Luke 13: 13-17

The Israelites who returned to Jerusalem from exile in Babylon had to build a new community and settled on a half church half state hybrid with their leaders mainly drawn from the religious teachers who developed into a group known as the Pharisees.

Today's Gospel reading is one of several occasions where Jesus and his disciples came into conflict with these religious leaders regarding working on the Sabbath. The fourth of the Ten commandments [Exodus 20: 8] had established a weekly pattern with the seventh day being a Sabbath on which no work was to be done. This would then allow rest, spiritual renewal and worship. The Pharisees had developed their own rigid interpretation of the Law with many detailed additions which effectively turned their religion into hollow ritual.

Today we read of Jesus healing a woman crippled for over eighteen years on the Sabbath in a synagogue. The synagogue leader complains that there are six days for work to come and be healed but is rebuffed by Jesus.

On another Sabbath Day, the Disciples picked and ate some grain which was classed as "work" by the Pharisees. [St Mark 2: 23-27]

The response to them included...

"The Sabbath was made for man, not man for the Sabbath" [St Mark 2:27]
