Recruitment...

Around AD 30, precisely in the fifteenth year of the reign of Tiberius Caesar, [St Luke 3: 1,2], John the Baptist fulfilled the prophesy of Isaiah by appearing from the wilderness to preach 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near' [St Matthew 3:2]. John soon attracted crowds who came to listen to him, to be baptised by him and to become one of his followers or disciples. Amongst these who were baptised was Jesus who was immediately led by the Spirit into the wilderness for forty days and at the end faced and withstood the three temptations. [St Matthew 4: 1-11] John had antagonised Herod Antipas, the tetrarch or district ruler of Galilee, by denouncing Herod's marriage to Herodias the divorced ex-wife of his half-brother Philip. John was arrested and thrown into prison and was eventually condemned and killed under Herod's orders.

On hearing of John's imprisonment, Jesus returned to Galilee and lived in Capernaum by the Sea of Galilee around Zebulun and Naphtali [St Matthew 4: 13]. St Matthew picks up a section of Isaiah's prophesy [Isaiah 9: 1,2] directed at this area where 'the people walking in darkness have seen a great light; on those living in the land of deep darkness a light has dawned'. Whilst in that area Jesus continued to preach and extended John's theme of 'Repent, for the kingdom of heaven has come near.'.

Whilst moving around the area Jesus begins to build up the team of disciples who would become his closest followers and would later be called Apostles and be responsible for the development and extension of the Church after the Resurrection and Ascension.

We first read of four Galilean fishermen who accepted a challenge. Andrew and his brother Simon Peter were fishing Jesus called them to become Fishers of Men. James and his brother John, sons of Zebedee, were working on their nets when they were called. All left their work and families to follow Jesus. [Matthew 4: 18-22]. Philip who was from the same town also received the command and obeyed and immediately went and fetched Nathanael also identified as Bartholomew. [St John 1: 44]

Matthew was working as a tax collector when Jesus passed by and called him to be a disciple. Of the other 5 disciples, [Thomas, James the son of Alpheus, Simon the Zealot, Judas Iscariot and Thaddeus], we do not know how or when they made the commitment but other than Judas Iscariot, they all formed part of the group of eleven who met together immediately after the Ascension. [Acts 1: 13]
