Public Worship and Private Prayer

Government instructions limit our ability to leave home for other than a few essential purposes and restrict where we can meet and who we can meet. With this in mind all public worship has been suspended within the churches of our Mission Partnership. This is due for review in February.

We have also decided not to open our Churches for private prayer through the same period.

Conversion of St Paul: 25th January

We first come across Saul of Tarsus as a young man in the account of the death of Stephen. He is described as consenting to Stephen's death [Acts 8:1].

Saul was a Roman citizen by birth but was brought up in Jerusalem and described himself as being 'of the Tribe of Benjamin, A Hebrew of the Hebrews, as to the Law a Pharisee' [Philippians 3:5].

He took part in the great persecution of the Church in Jerusalem and dragged many believers into imprisonment [Acts 8:3]. These actions actually helped to start the spread of the church as those who were scattered went about preaching the word [Acts 8:4]. We read of Phillip preaching in Samaria and to the Minister to Queen Candace of Ethiopia [Acts 8:5, 8:27].

Saul continued his opposition and gained permission from the High Priest to travel to Damascus in his quest to imprison believers.

Whilst on the road to Damascus he encountered a bright light from Heaven. He heard the words "Saul, Saul why do you persecute me?" It was the Risen Jesus. [Acts 9: 3-5]. Saul was rendered blind for three days and was told to enter Damascus.

There he encountered Ananias, a disciple who had been primed by the Lord in a dream to receive Saul. In this encounter, Saul's eyes were opened, and he was baptised. He immediately started preaching Jesus as the Son of God [Acts 9: 18-20].

He is first recorded as Paul whilst in Cyprus [Acts 13:9] but at that time many were referred to by their Hebrew name and the Roman equivalent. Paul being the Romanised version of Saul and seemingly what Paul himself preferred.

Paul was the author of up to thirteen of the twenty-seven books in our New Testament which continue to influence the theology, worship and pastoral life of the church. In his quest to spread the Good News he undertook Missionary journeys covering over 10,000 miles and established and nurtured at least fourteen churches.

Collect for Monday 25th January: Conversion of St Paul

Almighty God, who caused the light of the gospel to shine throughout the world through the preaching of your servant Saint Paul: grant that we who celebrate his wonderful conversion may follow him in bearing witness to your truth through Jesus Christ your Son our Lord, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever.
