The Feast of Purim

This is a Jewish festival known for lavish costumes, feasting, and the giving and receiving of gifts. It was established as a reminder of events during the exile in the Persian Empire. Its origins are recorded in the Book of Esther. If you have been keeping up with the daily readings, you will, during the past week, have read the first chapter and will complete the remaining chapters in the coming days.

Between 486 BC and 465 BC, Xerxes, known in Hebrew as Ahasuerus, was the ruler of the Achaemenid Empire which at its peak was the largest empire of its time. It stretched from the Balkans and Egypt in the west to central Asia and the Indus Valley in the east covering some two million square miles. It was founded around 550 BC and lasted until 330 BC when it fell to Alexander the Great.

The empire had over-run the Israelite Kingdom and exiled most of the people from Jerusalem and their homelands.

Such was the wealth generated by the Kingdom that Xerxes was able to host an extravagant celebration feast which lasted for six months. The final banquet lasted seven days. Queen Vashti, the first wife of Xerxes had, at the same time, hosted a similar seven-day banquet for the women. Xerxes summoned Vashti to show off her beauty to his guests but she refused. Vashti was permanently exiled, and Xerxes began the search for a new Queen.

Esther, also known as Hadassah, was the cousin and adopted daughter of Mordecai, one of those 'Jews exiled from Jerusalem. Part of a group of chosen young women, Esther found favour with Xerxes and became his second wife. Mordecai uncovered a conspiracy against Xerxes by two of the palace guards. He passed his information on to Queen Esther who told King Xerxes and the plot was foiled.

One of the royal nobles, Haman, who had been elevated to the highest position in court, was annoyed by Mordecai's refusal to bow down before him and urged Xerxes to kill Mordecai and all the other Jews within the Kingdom. The actual date for this massacre was set by casting lots. Mordecai passed on the fears of the people to Queen Esther who, despite the personal risk of approaching the King without being invited, was able to persuade Xerxes to reverse his edict.

This new edict gave the Jews the freedom to assemble and protect themselves against their enemies which they did. Xerxes remembered Mordecai's part in the foiling of the earlier conspiracy but had received no recognition for it. Mordecai became more prominent in the court and eventually became second only to the King.

The feast of Purim commemorates the saving of the Israelites from potential destruction and takes its name from the Persian word pur meaning to choose by lot.
