Up the Tower

The last weeks have been rather hectic for the Darfield bell ringers. It all started with urgent messages received on Thursday afternoon, 8th September, to be prepared to put 'Operation London Bridge' into action. As most of us had never even heard of it at that stage, this required some busy checking on the internet and consultation with other ringers. Then, just before our weekly practice, came the sad news that Queen Elizabeth II had died. It was decided to go ahead with the ringing with the bells half-muffled, as advised in Operation London Bridge. Muffles (leather pads) were hastily attached to the clappers of all our bells and ringing commenced with 6 tailors and 96 tolls of the tenor bell. This is an age-old practice whereby villagers could discover that someone had died – three strokes on the bell for a child, six for a woman and nine for a man, in each case followed by the age of the person who had died. The muffle on the bell quietens every other blow of the clapper and produces a lovely and yet mournful sound. We went on to ring some call changes (changing the order in which the bells sound) called 'Kings' and 'Queens'. And, of course, Chris had to climb to the top of the tower to lower the flag to half mast

We then rang again at 12 midday on the Friday, when as many bells as possible throughout the country were also ringing – all half or fully muffled. Our bells then continued to be rung muffled for any services or events until after the funeral on Monday, 19th. However, the flag briefly went back to full mast from 11am Saturday 10th in honour of the 'Proclamation of the King – Charles III – in accordance with instructions. Then back to half mast from Sunday 11th at 1 p.m. (again all thanks to Chris).

We rang for almost an hour before the funeral on Monday 19th, ringing our 'Kings' and 'Queens', with all our latest learners taking part. We then rang a special 'quarter peal' (about 48 minutes) of Plain Bob Doubles in the afternoon as the hearse carried the Queen's coffin to Windsor.

And finally, of course, Chris had to climb those steps to the top one last time to raise the flag back to full mast! It was an honour and a privilege to be amongst the ringers who rang throughout the country for our dear, departed Queen Elizabeth. Kay

Habakkuk, a minor prophet

The introductions to the majority of the Prophetic Books in the Old Testament identify the writer's background and family, and the dates within the history of the Israelites. The Prophet Habakkuk is different because we are only told one fact about him, that, in his own words, he was a Prophet. [Habbakuk 1: 1; 3: 1]. The headings within the NIV Bible divide the book into sections with two sets of complaints from Habakkuk and two responses from the LORD and ends with Habakkuk's Prayer.

Habakkuk was living at a time when the world seemed to be heading for disaster with a concern that the LORD was just allowing this to happen. The LORD's response indicates that this was written around 600 BC at the time that the Babylonian Empire was becoming stronger. [1: 6]. They would go on to capture Jerusalem and take the people of Judah into exile. In all of this though the righteous will live by faith [2: 4]

And we know that God causes everything to work together for the good of those who love God and are called according to his purpose for them. [Romans 8: 18]
