Publicans, Tax-Farmers and Disciples:

In the early days of the Roman Republic, taxes were collected directly from individuals and levied against their land, homes, slaves, animals, personal items and monetary wealth. As the Republic expanded through a series of conquests, the new provinces provided a larger tax base for collection. Taking an accurate census of the whole population proved difficult. The Gospel account of the census called by Caesar Augustus [St Luke 2: 1-3] tells us that all the population had to return to their ancestral homes to take part. Mary and Joseph were included and had to make the hazardous journey from their home in Nazareth to Bethlehem. [St Luke 2: 4-5]

The collection of taxes evolved into a system where communities were taxed rather than individuals. The system was controlled by the local Governors and Magistrates and the collection of taxes was devolved locally. Tax-Farmers were allowed to bid for the right to collect taxes in particular areas. This occurred every few years and the appointed Tax-Farmers had then to pay the State the full tax assessment for their areas in advance. The State did pay interest on what were effectively loans to the State. The Tax-farmer or Publican was then permitted to collect the taxes from his area. They were able to keep any collected amounts over and above their bid but would have to stand any potential shortfall. This led to many opportunities for corruption and scheming. Particularly in the occupied provinces like Palestine, the tax collectors were despised by the population and were seen as collaborators with the Roman Occupation. Jesus told a parable of a Pharisee and a Tax Collector both praying in the Temple. [Luke 18: 9-14]. The Tax Collector's prayer left him justified by God rather than the Pharisee.

St Matthew, one of the original disciples, was called directly from his tax-collecting duties in Capernaum and followed Jesus throughout the rest of His earthly ministry and beyond. [St Matthew 9: 9-12]. Whilst sharing a meal with Matthew, Jesus encountered more Tax Collectors and Sinners who had been invited by Matthew: [St Matthew 9: 10]. The Pharisees who were aware of the meal were critical of Jesus for eating with them.

Zacchaeus was the chief Tax-Collector in Jericho, who on hearing that Jesus was passing by, climbed up a tree to see Him over the crowds. Jesus saw Zacchaeus and called him down from the tree and invited Himself to a meal with Zacchaeus. As with the earlier encounter with Matthew, the Pharisees and people criticised Jesus for eating with the Tax-Collectors. [St Luke 19: 3-9]. Zacchaeus responded to Jesus by giving half of his possession to the poor and repaying four-fold any that he had cheated. [St Luke 19: 8].

For the Son of Man came to seek and to save the lost. [St Luke 19: 10]
