Epiphany: The manifestation of Christ to the Gentiles

Twelfth Night falls on the 5th January, the eve of Epiphany, and traditionally marks the end of the celebrations of Christmas. We link Epiphany to the Visit of the Wise Men from the East to Bethlehem as recorded in Matthew's Gospel Chapter 2. Their studies of the stars and of the Hebrew Scriptures linked the star's appearance to the birth of a new King

After Jesus was born in Bethlehem in Judea, during the time of King Herod, Magi from the east came to Jerusalem and asked, "Where is the one who has been born king of the Jews? We saw his star when it rose and have come to worship him." Matthew 2:1-2

Their encounter with King Herod and the Chief Priest and Scribes identified Bethlehem as the birthplace. Herod encouraged the Wise Men to locate the child and then to return to tell him so that he could also worship the child. With the help of the star the Wise Men found the house where Jesus was and presented the three symbolic gifts of Gold, Frankincense and Myrrh. The were warned in a dream not to revisit Herod and left for home without re-visiting Jerusalem.

As we read in Matthew 2:16-19, Herod was so furious that he ordered the murder of all the male children who were two or under living in and around Bethlehem.

Herod's plan to destroy what he saw as a rival King of the Jews was thwarted as Joseph had been warned in a dream to take his family to safety in Egypt where they stayed until after King Herod's death. The family then returned to relative safety in Nazareth.

The Gifts of the Wise Men

Three is another significant number in Scripture. Among many references we read of Jonah who was inside the great fish for three days and three nights [Jonah 1:17],[Matt 12:40]: the Holy Trinity – Father Son and Holy Spirit: Jesus was crucified at the third hour [Mark 15:25]: darkness fell for three hours from the sixth to the ninth hour [Mark 15:33], and Jesus rose on the third day. However there were not necessarily three Wise Men. The gifts have their own significance.

Gold is still sought after as a precious metal but is also the Metal of Heaven. In Revelation the streets of the New Jerusalem are made of gold so thin as to be transparent [Rev 21:21]. Gold symbolises divinity and kingship and recognises Jesus as King of Kings and Lord of Lords. On a more practical level it could well have eased the family's journey to, and their stay in Egypt.

Frankincense is an aromatic resin. Its pleasing aroma when burnt, represents the Prayers of the Saints [Rev 5:8]. Frankincense also symbolises the Priesthood of Jesus in making intercession for our sins. [1 John 2:1-2]

Myrrh is another aromatic resin and has been used as a perfume, incense and medicine over many centuries. It is used in embalming to mask the smells associated with dead bodies. Nicodemus, a member of the Sanhedrin who had earlier visited Jesus at night [John 3:1-22] brought myrrh with other spices to care for the body of Jesus after the crucifixion. [John 19:39]

The Feast of the Epiphany:

Creator of the heavens, who led the Magi by a star to worship the Christ-Child: guide and sustain us, that we may find our journey's end in Jesus Christ our Lord.
