Faith in Action

If we were to look up the definition of the word Faith in a modern dictionary we would find these two entries... 'complete trust or confidence' and 'firm belief especially without physical proof'. If we look to our Bible we find the definition "faith is confidence in what we hope for and assurance about what we do not see."

[Hebrews 1: 1].

St Paul in his letter to the Church at Ephesus writes that we are saved through faith freely given to us by the Grace of God.

People of Faith

Abel [Genesis 4: 1-16]

Cain and Abel were the first two sons of Adam and Eve. [Genesis 4: 1,2] Cain grew up to become an arable farmer whilst Abel became a shepherd. In due time both brought the first fruits of their labours as offerings to the LORD. Abel's offering was looked on with favour by the Lord, but Cain's was not.

In the description of the gifts, Cain brought 'some of the fruits of the soil' whilst Able brought the best of his efforts in the fat portions from some of the first-born lambs. Cain was angry and developed a jealous hatred for his brother which resulted in Cain killing Abel. The LORD then sentenced Cain to become a wanderer.

In his anger with the Teachers of the Law and Pharisees, Jesus tells them that they will be held to account for all the righteous blood that has been shed on Earth, including that of Abel [Matthew 23: 35]

Outward Signs: [Matthew 23: 1-12]

As part of the interactions between the Israelites and the Lordin the days after the Exodus from Egypt, they were given the instruction to 'Fix these words of mine in your hearts and minds; tie them as symbols on your hands and bind them on your foreheads.' [Deuteronomy 11: 18] Over the years, the strictly orthodox Jews took this command literally and created small leather boxes which could be strapped to their forehead and left arm during weekday morning prayers. These boxes called Tefillin or, from the 13th Century AD, phylacteries would contain small parchment scrolls inscribed with verses from the Torah, the first five books of the Hebrew Bible. Typical verses would be chosen from Exodus 13 and Deuteronomy 6, which would include reminders of the release from captivity in Egypt.

Jesus was preaching to the crowds and warned them against the Teachers of the Law and the Pharisees for heaping burdens onto the people but not on themselves. They 'make their phylacteries wide and the tassels on their garments long.' and did everything for people to see [Matthew 23: 5]. Jesus denounced the Teachers of the Law and the Pharisees as hypocrites, a word which is ultimately derived from the Greek worlds for stage actors who used to wear masks when in character. We have become all too aware of wearing masks for protection but let us ensure that in what we do, we follow this command of Jesus from the Sermon on the Mount.

"Let your light shine before men in such a way that they may see your good works, and glorify your Father who is in heaven" [Matthew 5: 16]
