John the Baptist: Prepare the Way

I will send my messenger ahead of you, who will prepare your way, a voice of one calling in the wilderness, 'Prepare the way for the Lord, make straight paths for him.' Mark 1: 2-3

The account of John's birth is linked with that of Jesus in Luke Chapter 1. Mary and John's mother Elizabeth are described as kinswomen and both births are revealed by the Angel Gabriel. Following John's naming, his father Zechariah, filled with the Holy Spirit, described him as "Your child will be called the prophet of the Most High for you will go before the Lord to prepare his ways" [Luke 1:76]. John spent many years living in the wilderness where, having become strong in Spirit, he is called by God. [Luke 3:2] John then travelled round the Region of the River Jordan, preaching a Baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins. He also foretold the coming of one mightier than himself who would baptise with the Holy Spirit. Jesus came to John for Baptism to mark the start of His own ministry and received a sign from Heaven in the form of the Holy Spirit as a dove descending on Him and a voice from Heaven "Thou art my Beloved Son; with Thee I am well pleased" [Luke 3:22] John had reproved Herod Antipas, Tetrarch of Galilee, for divorcing his wife and unlawfully marrying Herodias, his brother's wife. John was imprisoned by Herod and eventually executed.



An Important Message from our Treasurer

I have just been doing my annual guessing game – otherwise known as setting the budget for 2021. This year is, understandably, even trickier than usual. Will our church be open or closed? Will the Church hall turn in a profit or a loss (or even, how large will that loss be?) The one thing that I can be clearer about is where I expect us to be at the end of this year, 2020.

It currently appears that we will be spending £57,922 this year. Our income looks like it will be £52,802. So that means that we are likely to spend £5,120 more than we receive. £1,657 of that amount will come from our reserves. The remainder is manageable only because we brought forward a generous amount from 2019. Now, more than ever, every penny counts.

Thank you to so many of you who have maintained, and even increased, your giving in difficult circumstances. I have been encouraged and blessed to see the lengths that many of you have gone to in order to get your money to our church.

2021 will be as challenging, financially, if not more so. We have lost a number of regular givers one way or another in 2020, so our planned income going into 2021 is £9,600 per year less than it was going into 2020. However, I am lately being constantly reminded that God will provide and that God has a plan for us – as individuals and as a church. We just need to listen to His words and His plan, and to take action accordingly – again as individuals and as a church.

Bearing all the above in mind, I will doing my last collection and banking of regular giving envelopes in the next couple of weeks. Could you please contact me on 01226753041 if you would like me to collect your envelopes? Or you can drop them off at my house or at the church, during the open times for private prayer. Or even pass them to me via your 'buddy' who delivers your news sheets.
