Almighty God, the fountain of all goodness, bless our Sovereign Lord, King Charles, and all who are in authority under him; that they may order all things in wisdom and equity, righteousness and peace, to the honour of your name, and the good of your Church and people; through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

Downfall and Renewal: Today's Old Testament Reading Genesis 8: 1-19

Chapter 7 of the book of Genesis gives us the genealogy of Noah over nine generations back to Adam. We are told that Noah found favour with the LORD [Genesis 6: 8] when all around him the wickedness of the human race was increasing. So much so that the LORD considered putting an end to all people. [Genesis 6: 13]. Noah was instructed to build an Ark for his family, and pairs of animals, which would allow them to be safe. The sizes quoted for this construction equate to around half the length of a modern cruise liner.

Noah obeyed, built and loaded the Ark, and waited. We can only imagine the reaction from the rest of the people to Noah's task, but as soon as the doors of the Ark were closed it began to rain. For forty days the flood waters rose to cover the mountains and every living creature perished in the flood. The Ark floated on the water for 150 days [Gen 7: 24]

It is at this point that our Old Testament Reading set for today begins.

The LORD remembered Moses [8: 1] and caused the rain to cease and the flood waters to drain away. One hundred and fifty days later, the Ark came to rest on the mountains of Ararat in the east of the modern-day Republic of Türkiye. Noah sent out a dove which on the second attempt returned with a fresh olive leaf showing Noah that the Flood had indeed receded. [8: 10,11]

The waters dried up and Noah was instructed to bring the animals and come out of the Ark. [8: 16]. Noah's first act was to build an altar to the Lord and sacrifice burnt offerings [8: 20]

The promise of the Lord to not repeat this wholesale destruction was reinforced by a covenant with Noah which was to be remembered every time a rainbow appeared in the sky [9: 13]

"As long as the earth endures, seedtime and harvest, cold and heat, summer and winter, day and night will never cease." [8: 20]

In his first Epistle to God's Elect, St Peter uses Noah as an example and likens the waters of the flood to the water of Baptism. [1 Peter 3: 20,21] Eight people were saved in the Ark but many more can be and are saved by the waters of Baptism in the name of our Risen Saviour.

Stones:

There are many references to stones throughout our Bible. Many were used as reminder of encounters with the Lord and as places of sacrifice.

In the set readings for today, we find two distinct examples.

Steven was one of the seven chosen to supervise the daily distributions of food and so free up the Twelve for their ministry of the Word [Acts 6: 2,3,5]. Steven came to the notice of the Sanhedrin who seized him and falsely accused him of blasphemy. [Acts 6: 11-14]. In his defence before the Sanhedrin, Steven gave a powerful account of the history of Israel's relationship with God and accusing them of a failure to recognise Jesus as Messiah. Their reaction was to drag Steven out of the city and to stone him to death as the first recorded Christian martyr. [Acts 7:]

Jesus described Peter as the Rock on which His Church would be built [St Matthew 16: 18]. Peter later describes Jesus as the Living Stone, rejected by humans but chosen by God. The followers of Jesus are also described as *Living Stones built into a spiritual house, a holy Priesthood offering spiritual sacrifices acceptable to God through Jesus Christ* [1 Peter 2: 4,5].

The stone the builders rejected has become the cornerstone [1 Peter 2:7]
