A focus on the Saints: St Oswald (c604 - 642)

We can now sit in our pews in All Saints and contemplate the scenes of the Northern Saints in our East Window. St Oswald features in one of the main scenes.

Oswald was the son of King Aethelfrith of Northumbria. Following his father's death and the accession of his uncle, Edwin, Oswald was exiled to the Isle of Iona where he lived with the resident community of Irish monks and was converted to Christianity.

Oswald gained the throne of Northumberland in 633 by defeating Cadwallon of Gwynedd at the Battle of Hexham. Before the battle Oswald had a wooden cross erected and encouraged his army to join him in prayer. He had a vision of St Columba, founder of the Abbey on Iona, the night before the Battle in which he was promised that the Lord had granted him victory. Following the battle, the members of his council accepted Christianity and were baptised. Oswald then set out to convert the rest of his Kingdom. He asked the for assistance from th Irish of Dál Riata whose influence covered north-east Ireland and much of the Western coast of Scotland including Iona.

St Aiden and a group of monks were sent to Northumbria following Oswald's request and set up a monastery on Lindisfarne (Holy Island). The far-left light of our east window shows Aidan leaving Iona. In the early stages, Oswald had to translate Aidan's words from the Irish. The right-hand light shows Oswald's soldiers listening to these translations. Oswald died on 5th August 642 at the Battle of Maserfield against the Pagan King Penda of Mercia. Oswald soon came to be regarded as a Saint and the battle site became associated

St Aidan and his fellow monks had sown the seeds by visiting and re-visiting the Northumbrian settlements, walking and sharing their faith with the people they met.

God called Moses, through the Burning Bush, to lead the Israelites out of slavery in Egypt, as we can read in Exodus Chapter 3. God revealed His name to Moses, "I am who I am. This is what you are to say to the Israelites: 'I AM has sent me to you.'". [Exodus 3: 14].

In a clear description of who He truly is, Jesus told the Jewish religious leaders "Very truly I tell you, before Abraham was born, I am!" [St John 8: 581
