# **Twelfth Night and Epiphany**

The usual custom is that we keep our Christmas decorations on display until Twelfth Night which this year was on 5th January. In other traditions, decorations and celebrations continue until the Feast of Candlemas, some forty days after Christmas when we remember the Presentation of Christ in the Temple in accordance with the Jewish ordinances.

The Feast of the Epiphany is celebrated on January 6th, the day after Twelfth Night. The word comes from the Greek for appearance or manifestation. The events described in St Luke's Gospel [2: 1-20] show how the 'Good News of Great Joy' was revealed to the Shepherds on behalf of the Jewish nation. Their response was to "glorify and praise God" and to begin the spread of this news as they returned to their flocks. St Matthew's account of [2:1-12] the birth of Jesus describes the manifestation to the Gentiles – the non-Jews. The news is spread far and wide by means of a special star. The Wise Men who were prompted by this star to make the long journey to Jerusalem, and on to Bethlehem, were advisors and magicians to the courts of the rulers in what we now call the Middle East. Their study of the religious writings of the day would have included the Hebrew Scriptures. Particularly in the writings of the Prophets, they would have discovered the many references to the promised Messiah. We do not know whether any of their fellow wise man made the connection and the journey to find the Messiah.

The season of Epiphany moves us on from the manifestation of the new-born Jesus to that of the adult Jesus at the very start of his earthly ministry. John the Baptist had appeared in Judea preaching 'a baptism of repentance for the forgiveness of sins' [St Mark 1: 4]. Having spent the past years in relative obscurity in Nazareth, Jesus finds John and insists on receiving Baptism from him. As the next stage in the epiphany, the Holy Spirit descended on Him in bodily form like a dove. And a voice came from heaven: "You are my Son, whom I love; with You I am well pleased.' [St Luke 3: 22].

Throughout the years of its development, the Jewish nation had a special link to their LORD though the patriarchs, the Books of the Law, the Judges and some of their kings, and the prophets. As far as the rest of humanity, described as Gentiles, was concerned we read of very few individuals who attempted to seek the LORD. Rahab from Jericho assisted the spies that Joshua had sent out. [Joshua 2:] Ruth, a native of Moab, returned to Bethlehem with her mother-in-law Naomi and was an ancestor of King David. Naaman, the Commander of the Army of the King of Syria who after, being cleansed of his leprosy, took two mule loads of earth with him as a reminder of Israel and the LORD and to enable him to pray to the LORD.

As the church developed in the years after the Resurrection, even the Apostles had to come to terms with preaching the Gospel to non-Jews in a society where associating with them was forbidden. Peter was summoned by the Centurion Cornelius to go to Caesarea. [Acts 10:] Just before the servants bearing the summons arrived, Peter was given a vision in which God commanded him to eat of animals which Jewish tradition had declared unclean. This was an epiphany to Peter as he then went on to preach the Gospel to Cornelius and his relatives and close friends. The Holy Spirit came upon all who were there.

'Here there is no Gentile or Jew, circumcised or uncircumcised, barbarian, Scythian, slave or free, but Christ is all, and is in all.'

[Colossians 3: 11]


