Leprosy

Leprosy is a disease caused by a bacterial infection which damages nerves under the skin which leads to a lack of sensitivity, skin ulcers and muscle weakness. It is one of the oldest diseases in recorded history but can be cured and controlled with modern antibiotic drugs.

There are over sixty references to leprosy throughout the Old and New Testaments. During these times, those with leprosy faced rejection from society and often lived as beggars on the roadside.

The first Biblical reference to leprosy comes during the first encounter that Moses had with the LORD. Moses was tending the sheep of his father-in-law Jethro, close to Mount Horeb and diverted to investigate flames of fire from a bush that wasn't burning up. [Exodus 3: 2-3]. The LORD called to Moses from the bush and commissioned him to visit Pharoah to set in motion the events that would lead the Israelites out of Egypt. [Exodus 3: 4-23] Moses asked for signs to convince the Israelites that he was really guided by the LORD. One of these involved Moses putting his hand into his cloak which turned his hand leprous when he took it out and became healthy when repeated the actions. [Exodus 4: 6,7].

Once the Israelites had left Egypt, Miriam, the sister of Moses, and Aaron, his brother, had opposed Moses. Miriam was struck down with leprosy by the LORD as a punishment [Numbers 12: 10]

Perhaps one of the better-known lepers in the Old Testament was Naaman, Commander of the army of the King of Aram who was a valiant soldier and highly regarded by his King. [2 Kings 5: 1]. Naaman's wife had as a maid an Israelite girl, who had been captured on one of the army's raids on Israel. This young girl demonstrated her faith by suggesting that Naaman would be healed if he would only visit Elisha, "the Prophet who is in Samaria". [2 Kings 5: 3]. Naaman gained permission from his King to make the journey and eventually reached the house of Elisha. Without seeing him, Elisha told Naaman to go and wash seven times in the River Jordan. Naaman was upset, thinking that the rivers of his own country were better than the Jordan. His servants persuaded Naaman to perform this simple task and he was cleaned. [2 Kings 5:13,14]. His response to Elisha on seeing him was "Now I know that there is no God in all the world except in Israel" [2 Kings 5: 15]

Our Gospels record two incidents with Jesus and lepers. Not long after He started His ministry, Jesus encountered a leper who knelt and said "LORD, if you are willing, you can make me clean". [St Matthew 8:3 St Mark 1:41, St Luke 5:12]Jesus touched him, which would not have been done by any of the religious leaders of the day, and the leper was healed. The other event with a group of ten lepers, occurred as Jesus was making His final journey to Jerusalem. They asked for pity and were healed. [St Luke 17: 11-14] Only one of the ten, a Samaritan, returned to Jesus to give praise to God for his healing [St Luke 17: 15-19]
