News from the Bell Ringers

When we rang on Sunday 15th March we had no idea that it would be our last ringing for over four months and, sadly, our last ringing with David and Hilary as part of our band. We had plans for special ringing for a farewell to the Hildreds and for Easter, then suddenly... nothing!

You can imagine how pleased we were to get back to ringing on Sunday 2nd August in advance of the Church being open for private prayer. However, we have a 'new normal'. Social distancing rules apply so only four bells can be rung in any one session restricted to 15 minutes with 1,3,5 and 7 or 2,4,6 and 8 being the combinations. Your challenge is to tell which four bells we are ringing as we intend to alternate between the different sets of four bells every Sunday and Thursday.

Only four people can be in the tower during the session and ringers have to stay with the same bell and cannot touch any other rope or anything else in the tower for that matter. Windows and doors have to be left open for ventilation, so the noise of the bells is pretty loud up there!

There are precise instructions from the Central Council of Bell Ringers that there is to be no spitting on the ropes!!! (I hasten to add that we have NEVER spit on our ropes at Darfield).

But it is worth it all just to ring – and to get the feedback after our first ringing. This came from members of the congregation and from total strangers on Facebook. All said how wonderful it was to hear their dear old bells once more.
