Morning Prayer Bell

The Bishops have relaxed the restrictions around the use of churches just very slightly. It is now possible for the clergy to go into their church to pray, and to record or live-stream services if they so wish - but nobody else is allowed to be with them. For us it means that you'll hear the Morning Prayer bell chiming at 7:55am most days during the week, as a reminder that David is praying for the congregation and community.

Once again this week the resurrection doesn't feature directly in our Bible reading (John 14:1-14), but without it the words of Jesus in these verses would be empty promises. As well as this news sheet there is a message from David (on the website, or delivered with your paper copy of this sheet), and an extra message from Sue Lee.

Daily Hope

The Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby, has launched a free national phone line as a simple new way to bring worship and prayer into people's homes while church buildings are closed because of the coronavirus.

"Daily Hope" offers music, prayers and reflections as well as full worship services from the Church of England at the end of a telephone line.

The free phone line – which is available 24 hours a day on **0800 804 8044** – has been set up particularly with those in mind who are unable to join online church services during the period of restrictions. If you are able to get online, please don't use up the free minutes that have been donated to this service.

Although thousands of churches across the country are now running services and prayer groups online while public worship remains suspended, many people – especially older people – do not have access to the internet.

The line also recognises the impact of social distancing restrictions and self-isolation measures on those suffering from loneliness.

Callers will hear a special greeting from the Archbishop before being able to choose from a range of options, including hymns, prayers, services, reflections and advice on COVID-19.

Archbishop Justin said: "With many in our country on lockdown, it's important that we support those who are feeling lonely and isolated, whatever age they are. The Daily Hope service will allow people to hear hymns, prayers and words that offer comfort and hope, especially in this Easter season."

Let's continue to bear witness to Jesus the Light of the World with a candle in a window at 7:00pm each Sunday.
