Miracles

Miracles can be defined as unusual or wonderful events that cannot be explained by natural or scientific laws. Our Gospel accounts record a total of 37 miracles performed by Jesus during His earthly ministry. There must have been many more as, in the final words of his Gospel, St John writes that "Jesus did many other things as well" [21: 5]. The vast majority of these miracles were acts of healing which directly affected the individuals involved. Others showed the status of Jesus as he controlled the world around Him.

Jesus had spent forty days and nights in the wilderness following His Baptism by John and had resisted the temptations by the Devil to take an easy road to success, [St Matthew 4: 1-11].

His ministry of preaching "repentance for the Kingdom of God has come near" [St Matthew 4: 17] then began. He then called those who were to become His closest followers and who would eventually become the first leaders of the church to which we belong.

The first recorded miracle sees these disciples with Jesus and His mother Mary, at a wedding in Cana, just a few miles from Nazareth. The account is familiar in that, during the festivities, the wine provided for the guests ran out. With just a hint of reluctance, Jesus instantly created somewhere between 120 and 150 gallons of what the experts described as the best wine. [St John 2: 1-9]. In today's terms this would be between 720 and 900 bottles.

Could we perform this same miracle? Perhaps!? All we would need to do would be to plant around 100 vines. Use this water and much more to cultivate and care for them for at least five years. Then collect and process the grapes into wine with no guarantee of it being the best. The wedding guests would, of course, be long gone! Jesus then went on to travel around Galilee, teaching and proclaiming the Good News of the Kingdom and healing the sick [St Matthew 4: 23]

By this time John the Baptist had been put in prison by King Herod. He sent his disciples to Jesus asking "are you the one to come or should we expect someone else?" [St Matthew 11: 3]

The reply from Jesus was "The blind receive sight, the lame walk, those who have leprosy are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the good news is proclaimed to the poor." [Matthew 11:5]

In these words, Jesus is referencing the prophesy of Isaiah. [Isaiah 35: 5-6 and 61: 1-2].

John would have recognised these words and been reminded of the signs he was given when he baptised Jesus with the Holy Spirit descending as a dove on Jesus identifying Him as the Messiah.
