Pentecost:

¹ And when the day of Pentecost was fully come, they were all with one accord in one place. ² And suddenly there came a sound from heaven as of a rushing mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. ³ And there appeared unto them cloven tongues like as of fire, and it sat upon each of them. ⁴ And they were all filled with the Holy Ghost, and began to speak with other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. [Acts 2: 1-4 KJV]

The name **Pentecost** is derived from the Greek for fiftieth. The Jewish Festival of Weeks is celebrated 50 days after Passover as a thanksgiving for the Harvest. As with all the Jewish major Feasts, Jerusalem would have been crowded with visitors from "all the nations under Heaven" [Acts 2: 5]. The crowd included "Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya near Cyrene; visitors from Rome (both Jews and converts to Judaism); Cretans and Arabs" - [Acts 2: 9-11]. Today only Egypt, Libya and Rome are recognisable in this list which we can describe as the Middle East, Asia Minor and parts of North Africa.

The crowds were amazed that they could hear what the disciples were saying in their own language despite the speakers being Galileans, but some thought the disciples were drunk. Peter was the spokesman for them and after reminding them that I was only nine in the morning, guided the crowds through the prophesies of Joel [Joel 2: 28-32] regarding the pouring out of the Spirit of God on all people. Peter concluded his speech by saying "Therefore let all Israel be assured of this: God has made this Jesus, whom you crucified, both Lord and Messiah." [Acts 2: 30]

The crowds were 'cut to the heart' and asked what they should do [Acts 2: 37]. Peter's response to them was "Repent and Believe" Of those that heard the message, around three thousand accepted the message and were baptised.
