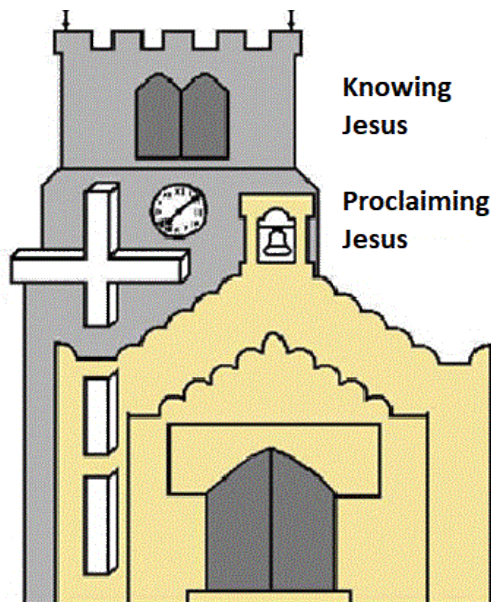

What's in a Book?

1 Kings

Solomon is established as king and was prompted by the LORD to ask for whatever he wanted. Solomon asked for '*a discerning heart to govern your people and to distinguish between right and wrong*' [1 Kings 3: 9]. Solomon was responsible for building the first Temple in Jerusalem and bringing the Ark of the Covenant into it. Solomon's fame spread, and he received a visit from the Queen of Sheba [1 Kings 10]. Solomon moved away from the LORD [1 Kings 18:9] and adversaries were raised up against him by the LORD.

Following Solomon's death, the kingdom was split with the tribes of Judah and Benjamin becoming the Kingdom of Judah in the South and the other ten tribes becoming the Northern Kingdom of Israel. The sequence of kings of both kingdoms varied in their relationships with the LORD.

Te Prophet Elijah is prompted by the LORD to predict a drought in the area during the reign of Ahab, King of Israel. This brought Elijah into conflict with Jezebel, Ahab's wife, following the LORD's victory over the prophets of Baal on Mount Carmel [1 Kings 18: 16-45]. Following threats from Jezebel, Elijah runs for his life to Mount Horeb where he is encouraged by the Still small voice of the LORD. [1 Kings 19:]
