Mark 12: 28-34

The Greatest Commandment

²⁸ One of the teachers of the law came and heard them debating. Noticing that Jesus had given them a good answer, he asked him, "Of all the commandments, which is the most important?"

The most important one," answered Jesus, "is this: 'Hear, O Israel: The Lord our God, the Lord is one. 30 Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind and with all your strength.' 31 The second is this: 'Love your neighbour as yourself.' There is no commandment greater than these."

"Well said, teacher," the man replied.
"You are right in saying that God is one and there is no other but him. "To love him with all your heart, with all your understanding and with all your strength, and to love your neighbour as yourself is more important than all burnt offerings and sacrifices."

When Jesus saw that he had answered wisely, he said to him, "You are not far from the kingdom of God." And from then on no one dared ask him any more questions.



What's in a book? Proverbs

The fear of the Lord is the beginning of knowledge, but fools despise wisdom and instruction. [Proverbs 1: 7].

A proverb is a short popular saying, usually of unknown age or origin, which expresses a common truth or a useful thought. I'm sure that we all use them in our daily conversations. One example could be 'if it isn't broken, fix it until it is" The writer sets out the purposes of this collection of writings which are for the reader to gain wisdom, instruction and insight into good and evil and prudent behaviour.
Many are directed to the young to teach them how to live a responsible and happy life on earth by living in accordance with God's wisdom.

A few chosen examples are

Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not rely on your own understanding. [Proverbs 3: 5]

A gentle answer turns away anger, but a harsh word stirs up wrath. [Proverbs 15: 11

Start a youth out on his way; even when he grows old, he will not depart from it. [Proverbs 22: 6]
